Raymond Cree Middle School's Academic Interventions

- 1. <u>Conferences</u> Contact your student's teachers to meet regarding grades and academics and your student's counselor to meet regarding personal/social and/or academic concerns.
- 2. <u>Classroom Visits</u> Parents may visit their student's class by request or per teacher request. Parent should inform office of request and/or specific teachers prior to visit
- 3. Ahead of the Game Tutoring Small group and individual after school tutoring in the library with staff and teachers. After school and lunch tutoring also available.
- 4. <u>Strategic/Intervention math classes and math bootcamp</u> Students are placed in specific math classes to grow their skills. In Math boot camp, students work in small groups to understand specific standards. Students selected based on formative assessments.
- 5. **ASES Tutoring** Qualifying students will be offered tutoring services while attending the ASES program.
- 6. <u>FEV Online Tutoring Services</u> This service is geared to support students in both English and Math. FEV tutors enable students to work 1:1 with virtual professional tutors.
- 7. <u>Daily Student Agenda checks</u> students may ask their teachers to check and initial their agendas for completeness and accuracy; parents would check that assignments are complete.
- 8. <u>ParentVue</u> Parents will be able to view their child's grades, assignments, attendance, contact teachers and more. Obtain access from registrar's office.
- 9. <u>Lunch Bunch</u> Supports students with a grade point average of 1.5 1.9 based on trimester progress reports and trimester grades. Students are cycled through grading periods and given academic and personal/social support with an emphasis on growth mindset. Students are assigned to this program by their counselors
- 10. **Newcomer Tutoring support** Designed to support English Language Learners and introduce robotics and engineering literacy to English learners.
- 11. <u>Student Study Teams Referral (SST)</u> formal meeting to discuss any problems or concerns that a parent or staff member has regarding a student, and to brainstorm interventions and create possible solutions. SST meetings are scheduled only after individual meetings and classroom interventions have been attempted. All referrals for consideration of a Special Education Assessment and/or Section 504 Plan begin with an SST meeting.
- 12. <u>Outreach Centers</u> Students may access homework support and/or tutoring at the following locations:
