Thank you all who participated, contributed and came out to see The PSHS Annual Homecoming parade. **Great Job Indians!**



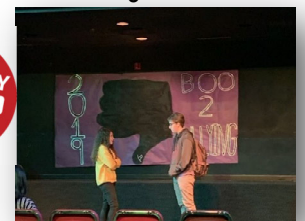
Office Staff In Halloween Spirit

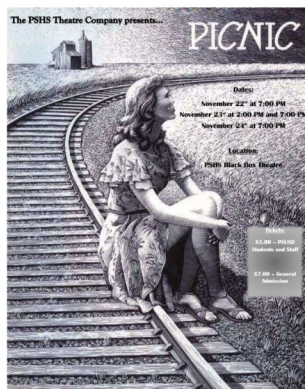

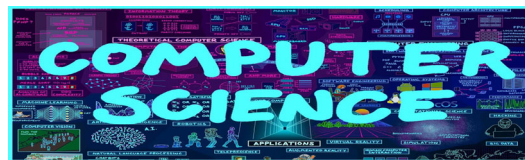

Palm Springs Wins 2nd annual Ramon Road Rivalry 17-14!



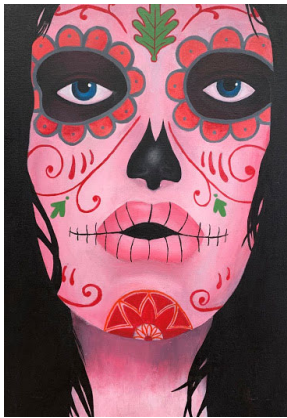
Congrats to PSHS for beating Rancho in the Ramon Road Rivalry. Thank you for all who came out to support. Crowd was fired up.

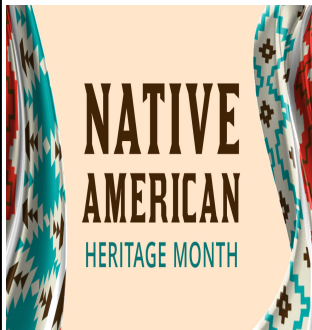
