

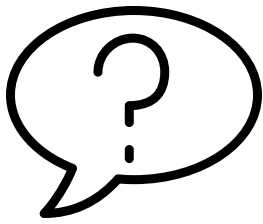

Why online school counseling?

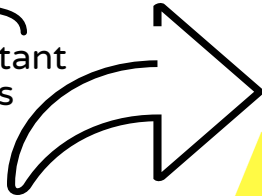
Maslow Hierarchy of Needs

Safety Needs

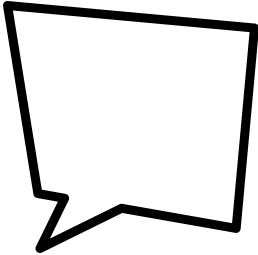
Personal Security, employment, resources, health, property

"Our kids and our families need us more than ever to model social and emotional learning before content"

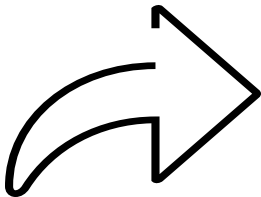
Why School Counseling Matters



- School counselors cause economically & a statistically significant increase in achievement (especially boys) and reduce misbehavior of boys (20%) and girls (29%)
- A marginal counselor is twice as effective in raising achievement as a marginal teacher hired to reduce class size
- Hiring one additional school counselor is equivalent to raising the quality of every teacher in the school

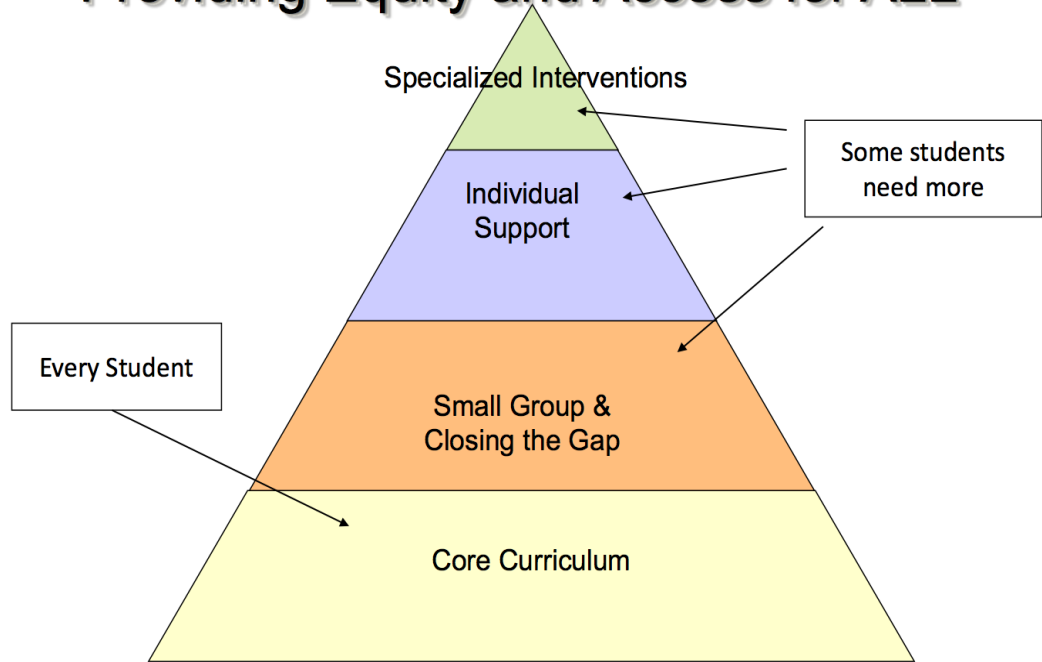

Multi-Tiered, Multi-Domain System of Supports (MTMDSS) was created and is depicted in the image below. Similar to MTSS and RtI, the **Multi-Tiered, Multi-Domain System of Supports (MTMDSS)** is a program planning and decision-making framework that utilizes an evidence-based practice approach to school counseling core curriculum and instruction aligned with assessments to address the needs of ALL students in the three domains of school counseling: academic, college and career, and social/emotional. (Hatch, 2017).
