Instructional Program

The Superintendent shall maintain a program of instruction that offers innovative, challenging, and equitable opportunities for all students to achieve at levels defined in the Board's **Results** policies.

The Superintendent will:

- 1. Ensure that all instructional programs are based on a comprehensive and objective review of best practices research.
- 2. Base instruction and curriculum on academic standards that meet or exceed state and/or nationally- recognized model standards and advance the achievement of the Board's Results policies.
- 3. Effectively measure each student's progress toward achieving or exceeding the standards.
- 4. Ensure that the instructional program includes opportunities for every student to develop talents and interests based on any of our academies, pathways and other innovative learning opportunities.
- 5. Ensure an equitable instructional program that addresses the needs of individual students of various backgrounds and abilities.
- 6. Find new and innovative programs.
- 7. Ensure that all instructional programs, including both content and practice, are regularly evaluated at least annually and modified as necessary to assure their continuing effectiveness.
- 8. Provide for daily instructional schedules and a district calendar necessary to best serve the learning needs of students and achieve the Board's *Results* policies.
- 9. Protect the instructional time provided for students during the academic day by limiting interruptions due to unnecessary intrusions, unnecessary teacher time out of the classroom, or the scheduling of activities that can be scheduled during other times.
- 10. Regularly evaluate instructional materials and maintain a procedure for reviewing such materials upon formal request by a parent or other stakeholder.
- 11. Adequately monitor and control student access to and utilization of electronically distributed information.

12. Ensure appropriate input from students, parents, teachers, administrators and other staff members involved in the instructional program as instructional materials are reviewed and selected.
